

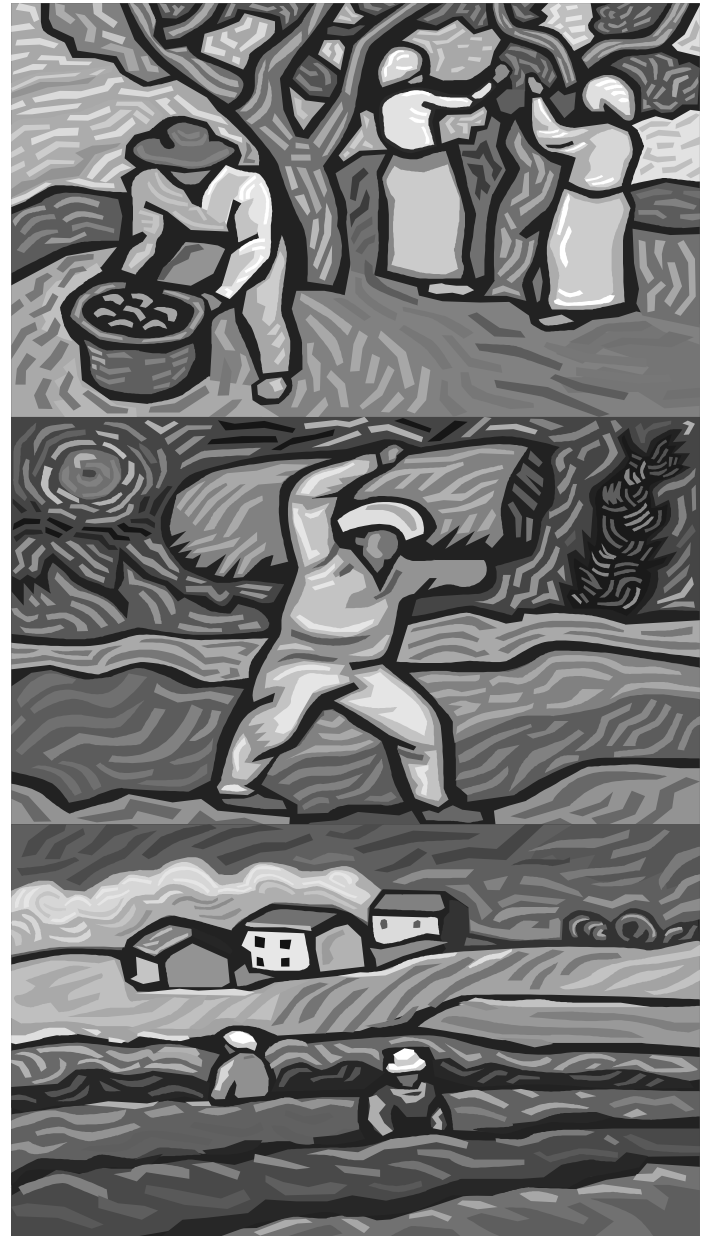

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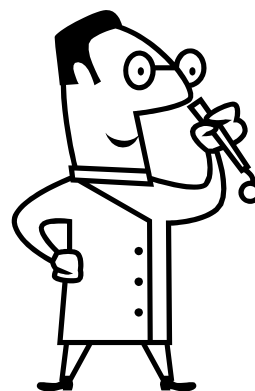
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PRONUNCIATION NOTES

Capital letters-

If you see a capital letter in the pronunciation line it signifies that you need to pronounce it as if you were reading the letter of the alphabet.

For example, pronunciation for the letter L in Spanish is L-A. To pronounce this you need to say the letter L and then the letter A.



ah- is pronounced like ah when the dentist says open your mouth and say ahhhh.

The pronunciation in this book was developed to aid you to hear the necessary sounds as the native Spanish speaker

pronounces the words on the CD It will help to read the pronunciation as you listen to the CD to develop your ability to pronounce the words and phrases in Spanish correctly.
