



What are they eligible for?

We have programs for children ages (3 to 21) that have recently moved (within the last 3 years) and have gaps in their education due to work in agriculture. These are through the Migrant Education Program and they are completely free.

These can include but are not limited to educational resources such as tutoring, assistance with high school equivalency programs, language classes, parental engagement programs, health screenings, and more.

You can help improve the future of these children.

Who is eligible?

Youth and children under the age of 21 who have moved in the past 3 years to work in agriculture or to accompany a parent or guardian that has worked in agriculture.

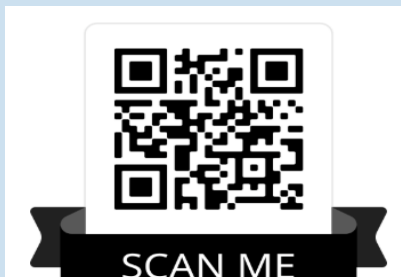
How you can help...

Many different types qualify. These include dairy work, meat processing, aquaculture, field preparation for crops, fruit and vegetable harvesting, work with livestock and much more.
